An act to amend Section 2425.3 of the Business and Professions Code, relating to medicine.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 2283, as amended, Oropeza. ~~Physician~~—*Physicians* and surgeons: cultural background and foreign language proficiency.

The Medical Practice Act provides for the licensure by the Medical Board of California of physicians and surgeons as well as other healing arts practitioners. The act requires each licensed physician to complete a questionnaire sent to him or her at the time of license renewal that seeks specified information. Existing law authorizes a physician to report to the board, and requires the board to collect, information regarding his or her cultural background and foreign language proficiency. Existing law permits this information to be placed on the board's Internet Web site.

This bill would require the information regarding cultural background and foreign language proficiency to be aggregated on an annual basis based on categories utilized by the board in the collection of the data, and to be aggregated by both statewide totals and ZIP Code of primary practice location. The bill would also require this information to be compiled and reported on the board's Internet Web site on or before ~~July~~ *October* 1 of each year.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. (a) It is the intent of the Legislature to
2 determine the number of physicians with cultural and linguistic
3 competency who are practicing medicine in California.

4 (b) Data on physicians serving any given area allows for the
5 consistent determination of which areas of California are
6 underserved by physicians with cultural or linguistic
7 competency.

8 SEC. 2. Section 2425.3 of the Business and Professions Code
9 is amended to read:

10 2425.3. (a) The Medical Board of California shall request
11 that a licensed physician report to the board at the time of license
12 renewal any specialty board certification he or she holds issued
13 by a member board of the American Board of Medical
14 Specialties or approved by the Medical Board of California.

15 (b) A licensed physician shall also report to the board at the
16 time of license renewal, his or her practice status, designated as
17 one of the following:

18 (1) Full-time practice in California.

19 (2) Full-time practice outside of California.

20 (3) Part-time practice in California.

21 (4) Medical administrative employment that does not include
22 direct patient care.

23 (5) Retired.

24 (6) Other practice status, as may be further defined by the
25 Division of Licensing.

26 (c) (1) A licensed physician may report to the board at the
27 time of license renewal, and the board shall collect, information
28 regarding his or her cultural background and foreign language
29 proficiency.

30 (2) Information collected pursuant to this subdivision shall be
31 aggregated on an annual basis based on categories utilized by the
32 board in the collection of the data, and shall be aggregated by
33 both statewide totals and ZIP Code of primary practice location.

34 (3) Aggregated information under this subdivision shall be
35 compiled annually and reported on the board's Internet Web site
36 on or before ~~July~~ *October 1* of each year.

- 1 (d) The information collected pursuant to subdivisions (a) and
- 2 (b) of this section may also be placed on the board's Internet
- 3 Web site.

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
