An act to amend Section 1294 of the Code of Civil Procedure, relating to arbitration.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL’S DIGEST

AB 1062, as amended, Dickinson. Arbitration: appeals.

Existing law specifies those types of orders and judgments from which an appeal may be taken, including, an order dismissing or denying a petition to compel arbitration.

This bill would limit that basis from which an appeal may be taken to an order dismissing or denying a petition to compel arbitration if the ~~arbitration is for the adjudication of a dispute over the terms of a public or private sector collective bargaining agreement or memorandum of understanding~~ *party who opposed the petition to arbitrate is 65 years of age or older or a dependent adult, as defined.*

*The people of the State of California do enact as follows:*

1     SECTION 1. Section 1294 of the Code of Civil Procedure is  
2     amended to read:

1 1294. An aggrieved party may appeal from any of the  
2 following:

3 (a) An order dismissing or denying a petition to compel  
4 ~~arbitration if the arbitration is for the adjudication of a dispute over~~  
5 ~~the terms of a public or private sector collective bargaining~~  
6 ~~agreement or memorandum of understanding.~~ *arbitration, unless*  
7 *the party who opposed the petition to arbitrate the civil action in*  
8 *court is 65 years of age or older or a dependent adult, as defined*  
9 *in Section 15610.23 of the Welfare and Institutions Code.*

10 (b) An order dismissing a petition to confirm, correct, or vacate  
11 an award.

12 (c) An order vacating an award unless a rehearing in arbitration  
13 is ordered.

14 (d) A judgment entered pursuant to this title.

15 (e) A special order after final judgment.
