An act to add Sections 89528.5 and 92612.5 to the Education Code, relating to postsecondary education employees.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 495, as introduced, Yee. Postsecondary education employees: physicians.

Existing law requires the Trustees of the California State University to establish a supplemental salary program in order to improve the recruitment and retention of faculty in specified academic disciplines and requires the University of California to administer the Community-Based Health Professions Education Partnership Program.

This bill would require the California State University to increase the compensation of physicians employed at student health centers on campuses of the California State University until the compensation is comparable to the compensation earned by physicians employed at student health centers on campuses of the University of California. The bill would request the University of California to increase the compensation of physicians employed at student health centers on campuses of the University of California if the compensation of physicians employed at a student health center on a different campus of the University of California is increased.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 89528.5 is added to the Education Code, 2 to read:

89528.5. The California State University shall increase the compensation of physicians employed at student health centers on campuses of the California State University until the compensation is comparable to the compensation earned by physicians employed at student health centers on campuses of the University of California.

9 SEC. 2. Section 92612.5 is added to the Education Code, to 10 read:

92612.5. The University of California is requested to increase the compensation of physicians employed at student health centers on campuses of the University of California if the compensation of physicians employed at a student health center on a different campus of the University of California is increased.
