LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 1342, as introduced, Steinorth. Pupil transportation.

Existing law authorizes the governing board of any school district to provide for the transportation of pupils to and from school whenever, in the judgment of the governing board of the school district, the transportation is advisable and good reasons exist therefor.

This bill would make nonsubstantive changes to that provision.

A The governing board of a school district may allow the transportation of preschool or nursery school pupils in 5 schoolbuses owned or operated by the school district. A state 6 7 reimbursement may not be received by a school district for the 8 transportation of preschool or nursery school pupils.

(b) As used in this article, "municipally owned transit system" means a transit system owned by a city, or by a district created under pursuant to Part 1 (commencing with Section 24501) of

Division 10 of the Public Utilities Code. 12
