An act to-amend Section 51225.35 of the Edueation Code, relating sementum add Section 75131 to the Public Resources Code, relating to state government.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST
AB 1873, as amended, Holden. Seheol eurrieulum: high seheol graduation requirements: mathematies: computer seienee.-Strategic Growth Council: Board of Infrastructure Planning, Development, and Finance.

Existing law establishes the Strategic Growth Council and requires the council, among other things, to identify and review the activities and funding programs of member state agencies that may be coordinated to improve air and water quality.

This bill would establish within the council a Board of Infrastructure Planning, Development, and Finance, consisting of the Governor, the Treasurer, the Controller, the Secretary of Transportation, the Director of General Services, one member selected by the President pro Tempore of the Senate, and one member selected by the Speaker of the Assembly. The bill would require the board to categorize and recommend the priority of the state's infrastructure needs and develop funding to finance those projects.

Existing law requires eaeh pupil completing grade 12 to satisfy certain requirements as a condition of receiving a diploma of graduation from high sehool. These requirements inelude the eompletion of designated
eoursework in grades 9 to 12 , inelusive, ineluding the completion of at least 2 courses in mathematies, 2 courses in seience, ineluding biologieal and physieal seiences, and one course in vistal or performing arts, foreign language, or eareer teehnieal edueation. Existing law authorizes the governing beard of a sehool distriet to adopt additional coursework requirements. Existing law authorizes the governing board of a sehool district that requires the completion of more than 2 courses in mathematies for graduation from high sehool to award a pupil up to ene mathematies course eredit for suecessfully completing an approved eomputer seienee course, as provided.
This bill would make nonsubstantive changes to that latter provision.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 75131 is added to the Public Resources Code, to read:
75131. (a) There is within the council a Board of Infrastructure Planning, Development, and Finance. The board shall consist of the Governor, the Treasurer, the Controller, the Secretary of Transportation, the Director of General Services, one member selected by the President pro Tempore of the Senate, and one member selected by the Speaker of the Assembly.
(b) The board shall categorize and recommend the priority of the state's infrastructure needs and develop funding to finance those projects.

SECTION 1. Section 51225.35 of the Edtueation Code is amended to read:
51225.35. (a) (1) If the governing board of a sehool distriet requires more than two courses in mathematies for graduation from high sehool, the governing board of the sehool distriet may award a pupil up to one mathematies course eredit pursuant to subparagraph (B) of paragraph (1) of subdivision (a) of Seetion 51225.3 for surecessfully completing a "eategory C" approved eomputer seience course.
(2) The governing board of the sehool district is eneouraged to ensure that any computer seience course that the sehool distriet awards a pupil mathematies course credit for pursuant to paragraph (1) builds upon fundamental mathematies content.
(3) The governing board of the sehool district is eneouraged to support sehools in submitting any computer seience coutrse that a sehool wishes to use to fulfill sehool distriet imposed mathematies subject area requirements to the University of California for eertifieation and addition to the sehool's " $\mathrm{A}=\mathrm{G}$ " course list.
(b) For purposes of this section, "eategory C" refers to the "A-G"admission requirements for the California State University and the University of California.
