CHAPTER \_\_\_\_

An act to add Section 24013.5 to the Business and Professions Code, relating to alcoholic beverages.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 1042, Alpert. Alcoholic beverages: licenses: denial.

Existing law prohibits a license from being issued for any premises for which an application for a license has been denied, or at which a license has been revoked, for reasons pertaining to the premises, unless one year has elapsed from the date the order becomes final.

This bill would also prohibit a license from being issued for any premises for which a license has been denied, for reasons pertaining to the premises, twice within a 36-month period, unless 2 years have elapsed from the date that the last order becomes final.

*The people of the State of California do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section 24013.5 is added to the Business and Professions Code, to read:

24013.5. (a) No license shall be issued for any premises for which a license has been denied or revoked, for reasons pertaining to the premises, unless one year has elapsed from the date the order becomes final.

(b) No license shall be issued for any premises for which a license has been denied, for reasons pertaining to the premises, twice within a 36-month period, unless two years have elapsed from the date that the last order becomes final.
