An act to amend Sections 20391, 20392, 20393, 20405, 20409, 21151, and 21155 of, and to repeal Section 20017.791 of, the Government Code, relating to public employees.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 2039, as introduced, Committee on Public Employment and Retirement. Public employees: retirement.

The Public Employees' Retirement Law prescribes retirement benefits for persons included in the state peace officer/firefighter membership category.

The bill would update and revise the lists of persons included in that category of membership.

Vote: majority. Appropriation: no. Fiscal committee: no. State-mandated local program: no.
