An act to ~~amend Section 61600 of~~ *add Section 61601.31* to the Government Code, relating to community services districts.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 2137, as amended, Johannessen. Community services districts.

Existing law prescribes the purposes and powers of community services districts.

This bill would additionally grant community services districts *entirely or partly within Glenn County* the power of constructing, maintaining, and operating flood control and protection works and facilities, as specified.

Vote: majority. Appropriation: no. Fiscal committee: no. State-mandated local program: no.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 ~~SECTION 1. Section 61600 of the Government Code~~
2 *SECTION 1. Section 61601.31 is added to the*
3 *Government Code, to read:*
4 *61601.31. In addition to the powers that may be*
5 *exercised pursuant to Sections 61600 and 61601, any*
6 *community services district, either entirely or partly*

1 within Glenn County, may construct, maintain, and
2 operate flood control and protection works and facilities,
3 and, for those purposes, exercise all of the powers
4 specified for reclamation districts in Part 5 (commencing
5 with Section 50900) of Division 15 of the Water Code. The
6 functions to be performed by the board, officers, and
7 agents of a reclamation district pursuant to that part may
8 be performed by the equivalent board, officers, and
9 agents of an affected community services district.
