An act to amend Section 375 of the Public Utilities Code, relating to public utilities.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 1082, as amended, Calderon. Public Utilities Commission: electric restructuring.

The Public Utilities Act requires the Public Utilities Commission to allow the recovery of certain reasonable employee related transition costs relating to the restructuring of the electric industry.

This bill would *modify that provision to* require the commission to deem *allow* the recovery of employee related transition costs, as described in that provision to be reasonable, unless the commission makes a specific finding that those costs are not, if the commission specifically finds that those costs are reasonable.

Vote: majority. Appropriation: no. Fiscal committee: yes. State-mandated local program: no.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The Public Utilities Commission shall deem the recovery of employee related transition costs as described in Section 375 of the Public Utilities Code to be reasonable, unless the Public Utilities Commission makes a specific finding that those costs are not reasonable.

SECTION 1. Section 375 of the Public Utilities Code is amended to read:

- 375. (a) In order mitigate to potential 9 impacts on utility personnel directly affected by electric 10 industry restructuring, as described in Decision 95-12-063, as modified by Decision 96-01-009, the commission shall 12 allow the recovery of reasonable employee 13 transition costs incurred and projected for severance, 14 retraining, early retirement, outplacement and related expenses for the employees, if it finds those costs to be 16 reasonable.
- (b) The costs, including employee related transition 17 18 costs for employees performing services in connection 19 with Section 363, shall be added to the amount of 20 uneconomic costs allowed to be recovered pursuant to 21 this section and Sections 367, 368, and 376, provided 22 recovery of these employee related transition costs shall 23 extend beyond December 31, 2001, provided recovery of 24 the costs shall not extend beyond December 31, 2006. 25 However, there shall be no recovery for employee 26 related transition costs associated with officers, senior employees. professional supervisorv and employees 28 performing predominantly regulatory functions.
