An act to add Chapter 8.2 (commencing with Section 25720) to Division 15 of the Public Resources Code, relating to fuel resources: fuel supply.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 2076, as amended, Shelley. State Energy Resources Conservation and Development Commission: fuel supply.

Existing law requires the State Energy Resources and Conservation and Development Commission to develop contingency plans to deal with possible shortages of electrical energy or fuel supplies to protect public health, safety, and welfare.

This bill would require the commission, after determining certain facts concerning to examine the feasibility of operating a strategic gasoline reserve and to examine and recommend an appropriate level of reserves,. Upon a finding by the commission that it would be feasible to operate such a reserve, the bill would authorize the commission to establish and administer a strategic fuel reserve.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 8.2 (commencing with Section 25720) is added to Division 15 of the Public Resources Code, to read:

Chapter 8.2. Strategic Fuel Reserve

25720. In order to insulate California consumers and businesses from dramatic price increases arising from supply interruptions, it is the intent of the Legislature to establish a strategic fuel reserve to be administered by the commission.

25721. (a) Not later than July 1, 2002, the commission shall establish the California Strategic Fuel Reserve.

25720. (a) By July 1, 2001, the commission shall 15 examine the feasibility, including possible costs and 16 benefits to consumers and impacts on gasoline prices for 17 the general public, of operating a strategic gasoline 18 reserve to insulate California consumers and businesses 19 from substantial short-term price increases arising from 20 refinery outages and other similar supply interruptions. 21 In evaluating the potential operation of a strategic 22 gasoline reserve, the commission shall consult with other state agencies, including, but not limited to, the State Air 24 Resources Board.

(b) The commission shall determine examine 26 recommend an appropriate level of reserves of gasoline 27 to insulate California consumers and businesses from 28 substantial, short-term price increases arising from 29 refinery outages or other similar supply interruptions, 30 but in no event may the reserve be less than the amount 31 of refined gasoline that the commission estimates could 32 be produced by the largest California refiner over a two 33 week period. In making this determination examination 34 and recommendation, the commission shall take into 35 account all of the following:

(1) Inventories of California-quality fuels or fuel components reasonably available the California market.

- (2) Current and historic levels of inventory of fuels.
- (3) The availability and cost of storage of fuels.

- (4) The potential for future supply interruptions, price spikes, and the costs thereof to California consumers and businesses.
- (c) The commission shall establish, by regulation, 10 evaluate a mechanism-allowing to release gasoline from the reserve that permits any customer to contract at any time for the delivery of gasoline from the reserve in 12 13 exchange for an equal amount of gasoline that the 14 eustomer delivers meets California specifications and is 15 produced from a source outside of California that the 16 customer agrees to deliver back to the reserve that meets 17 California specifications from a refinery outside of 18 California. The gasoline shall be delivered back to the 19 reserve within a time period to be established by the 20 commission, but not longer than six weeks. Preference may be given to customers that will use the gasoline to reduce prices to California consumers. weeks.
 - (d) The commission shall develop evaluate reserve storage space from existing facilities to the extent feasible.
 - (e) The commission may adopt additional regulations necessary for the administration and implementation of this article.
 - (f) The commission shall report to the Legislature on the progress and proposed operation of the reserve no later than July 1, 2001.
