LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 2638, as introduced, Calderon. Public utilities: extension of service.

The Public Utilities Act requires the Public Utilities Commission to continue to enforce the rules governing the extension of service by gas and electrical corporations to new residential, commercial, agricultural, and industrial customers in effect on January 1, 1982, except as specified.

This bill would make technical, nonsubstantive changes in those provisions.

Vote: majority. Appropriation: no. Fiscal committee: no. State-mandated local program: no.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 783 of the Public Utilities Code 2 is amended to read:
- 3 783. (a) The commission shall continue to enforce

existing rules to permit applicants for service to install extensions in accordance with subdivision (f). Except for periodic review provisions of existing rules, and 4 amendments to permit installations by an applicant's 5 contractor, the commission shall may not investigate amending these rules or issue any orders or decisions which that amend these rules, unless the investigation or proceeding for the issuance of the order or decision is conducted pursuant to subdivision (b).

- (b) Whenever commission the institutes 11 investigation into the terms and conditions the 12 extension of services provided by gas and electrical 13 corporations to new or existing customers, or considers 14 issuing an order or decision amending those terms or 15 conditions, the commission shall make written findings 16 on all of the following issues:
- (1) The economic effect of the line and service 18 extension terms and conditions upon agriculture. 19 residential housing, mobilehome parks, rural customers, customers, employment, and commercial 21 industrial building and development.
- (2) The effect of requiring new or existing customers 23 applying for an extension to an electrical or gas 24 corporation to provide transmission or distribution 25 facilities for other customers who will apply to receive 26 line and service extensions in the future.
- (3) The effect of requiring a new or existing customer 28 applying for an extension to an electrical or gas corporation to be responsible for the distribution of, 30 reinforcements of, relocations of, or additions to that gas or electrical corporation.
 - (4) The economic effect of the terms and conditions upon projects, including redevelopment projects, funded or sponsored by cities, counties, or districts.
- (5) The effect of the line and service extension 36 regulations, and any modifications to them, on existing ratepayers.
- 38 (6) The effect of the line and service extension regulations, and any modifications to them, on consumption and conservation of energy.

(7) The extent to which there is cost-justification for a special line and service extension allowance agriculture.

- (c) The commission shall request the assistance of 5 agencies and departments appropriate state conducting any investigation or proceeding pursuant to subdivision (b), including, but not limited to, 8 Business, Transportation and Housing Agency, 9 Department of Food and Agriculture, the Department of 10 Consumer Affairs, the Department of Real Estate, the Department of Housing and Community Development, 12 and Department of Economic and the **Business** 13 Development.
- (d) Any new order or decision issued pursuant to an 15 investigation proceeding conducted pursuant or 16 subdivision (b) shall become effective on July 1 of the year which follows following the year when the new order 18 or decision is adopted by the commission, so as to ensure that the public has at least six months to consider the new 20 order or decision.
- (e) The commission shall conduct any investigation or 22 proceeding pursuant to subdivision (b) within 23 commission's existing budget, and any state agency or department which that is requested by the commission to provide assistance pursuant to subdivision (c) shall also within the 26 provide the assistance agency's department's existing budget.
- (f) An electrical or gas corporation shall permit any 29 new or existing customer who applies for an extension of 30 service from that corporation to install a gas or electric 31 extension in accordance with the regulations of 32 commission and any applicable specifications of 33 electrical or gas corporation.
