## **Introduced by Senator Bowen**

An act to amend Section 348 of the Public Utilities Code, relating to public utilities. An act to add Section 10910.2, to the Education Code, relating to computer access, and making an appropriation therefor.

## LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 1774, as amended, Bowen. Public utilities: electrical restructuring Computer access.

Existing law authorizes school districts to organize, promote, and conduct programs of community recreation as well as contribute to the attainment of general educational and recreational objectives for children and adults of the state. Existing law declares that it is in the interest of the people and of the state that there be a general diffusion of knowledge and intelligence through the establishment and operation of public libraries.

This bill would require the State Department of Education to establish a grant program to encourage schools to keep their computer facilities open and available to the public on evenings and weekends and to encourage public libraries that have Internet access to extend the hours and days during which access is available to the public. The bill would provide grant funds to cover the additional costs incurred by the schools and libraries, as well as provide for the cost of technical assistance at a level determined by the State Department of

Education. The bill would require a school to implement a program that enlists pupil volunteers to provide technical support as a condition to receiving the grant.

The bill would appropriate an unspecified sum from the General Fund to the State Department of Education, according to a specified schedule, to fund the grant programs.

The Public Utilities Act requires the Independent System Operator to adopt inspection, maintenance, repair, and replacement standards, on or before September 30, 1997, for the transmission facilities under its control, and standards for reliability and safety during periods of emergency and disaster. Existing law requires the Independent System Operator to report to the Oversight Board, at those times specified by the Oversight Board, on the development and implementation of the standards in relation to facilities under the operational control of the Independent System Operator.

This bill would require the Independent System Operator to report quarterly to the Oversight Board.

- 10910.2. The State Department of Education shall 6 establish a grant program to encourage schools to keep their computer facilities open and available to the public 8 on evenings and weekends, and to encourage public 9 libraries that have Internet access to extend the hours and 10 days during which access is available to the public. The grants shall cover the additional costs incurred by a school 12 or library as well as provide for the cost of technical 13 assistance at a level determined by the State Department 14 of Education. As a condition to receiving a grant, a school 15 must implement a program that enlists pupil volunteers 16 to provide technical support.

equipment or facility, shall provide for high quality, safe, and reliable service. In adopting its standards, the 3 Independent System Operator shall consider all of the 4 following: cost, local geography and weather, applicable engineering judgment, and experience. The 5 6 7 Independent System Operator shall also adopt standards for reliability, and safety during periods of emergency 8 9 and disaster. The Independent System Operator shall report quarterly to the Oversight Board on the 10 development and implementation of the standards in 12 relation to facilities under the operational control of the Independent System Operator. The Independent System 13 14 Operator shall require each transmission facility owner or operator to report annually on its compliance with the 15 standards. That report shall be made available to the 16 17 public.
