SENATE BILL

An act to add Section 10910.2 to the Education Code, relating to computer access, and making an appropriation therefor.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 1774, as amended, Bowen. Computer access.

Existing law authorizes school districts to organize, promote, and conduct programs of community recreation as well as contribute to the attainment of general educational and recreational objectives for children and adults of the state. Existing law declares that it is in the interest of the people and of the state that there be a general diffusion of knowledge and intelligence through the establishment and operation public libraries.

This bill would require the State Department of Education to establish a grant program to encourage schools to keep their computer facilities open and available to their pupils and their families—and. The bill would also require the State Librarian to encourage public libraries and public access computer technology centers, as defined, that have Internet

access to extend the hours and days during which access is available to the public. The bill would provide grant funds to cover the additional costs incurred by the schools, libraries, and public access computer technology centers as well as provide for the cost of technical assistance at a level determined by the State Department of Education and the State Librarian, respectively. The bill would require the grant program to establish preferences, as specified. The bill would require that a grant made under the program not exceed \$100,000. The bill would require grantees to hire staff and recruit volunteers with appropriate levels of knowledge and expertise and would require a school to implement a program that enlists pupil volunteers to provide technical support as a condition to receiving the grant.

The bill would appropriate an unspecified sum from the Fund to the State Department of Education, according to a specified schedule, to fund the grant programs.

- (a) The ability to use a computer and the Internet are 3 becoming critical skills that are necessary for participation in modern society.
- (b) The disparate access to computers 6 Internet is known as the "digital divide" and is related to individual's income, ethnicity, geographic 8 location. - (c) A cost-effective way of helping to bridge the digital 14

SEC. 2. Section 10910.2 is added to the Education 1 2 Code, to read:

- 3 10910.2. (a) The State Department of Education shall establish a grant program to encourage schools to keep their computer facilities open and available to their pupils and their families, and the State Librarian shall establish a grant program to encourage public libraries and public access computer technology centers that have Internet access to extend the hours and days during 10 which access is available to the public. The grants shall cover the additional costs, excluding costs for the 12 construction or lease of the facilities, incurred by a school, public access computer technology center, or library as 14 well as provide for the cost of technical assistance at a 15 level determined by the State Department of Education 16 and the State Librarian, respectively. As a condition to receiving a grant, a school must implement a program 18 that enlists pupil volunteers to provide technical support.
- (b) The grant program established pursuant to this 20 section shall establish preferences for the following:

- public (1) Schools. access computer technology 22 centers, and libraries with substantial local and private 23 sector support.
- (2) Schools, public access computer technology 25 centers, and libraries located in areas with poor computer access, such as rural and low-income areas.
- (c) Grantees shall hire staff and recruit volunteers 28 with appropriate levels of computer knowledge expertise.
 - (d) No grant awarded under the program shall exceed one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000).
- (e) For the purposes of this section, "public access computer technology center" nonprofit means a 34 community-based center located in low-income a 35 neighborhood that provides access to technology and the 36 Internet and technology skills training to underserved populations, including, but not limited to, youth. The 38 purpose of the public access computer technology center 39 is to provide opportunities for the general public to become trained and knowledgable in the use
